


Care Management Dashboard Product Update – June 2018

Based on feedback from you, we've made some modifications to the <u>Care Management Dashboard</u> to provide more information and simplify your experience in viewing patient data:

1. The new **Active Panel Members** tab at the top of the Dashboard screen allows you to see **all** patients on your panel, help identify those who need your help most, and even find one specific patient that you are looking for.




- View <u>all</u> your active patients in one report
- Find one specific patient on your panel (Sort or Filter by Last Name)
- Identify which patients need your help most (Sort or Filter to view highest Charlson Comorbidity risk, or highest ED or inpatient visits)
- Easily sort this list to <u>identify those enrolled/not enrolled</u> in <u>CurrentCare</u> (Sort or Filter on CurrentCare Status)
- Update your patient <u>phone & addresses</u> we show you both what was provided most recently by a
 hospital or skilled nursing facility, as well as the phone # and address provided by your organization
 (indicated with an * asterisk)


Note: This list does not include any encounter-specific data, as this is simply the list of patients that your organization identified to be included in your panel.

 Patient encounter detail reports are simplified. Click on MPIID, Six Month ED Visits, or Six Month Inpatient Visits. On the new drop down menu, you will now need to click "View All Encounters for ..."



The report now displays patient demographic information at the top of the screen, and you can easily see important encounter details (hospital, date, Reason for Visit), without having to scroll:



We've improved the overall look & feel, based on your feedback:

- The Active Panel Member list, along with any reports, now include gridlines to make viewing the data a little easier;
- We've also removed the color green, which was used to highlight low risk levels, so you can focus on the moderate risk patients (in yellow) and high risk patients (in red).
